




DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE



Fall Tour October 6, 2012

Many thanks to **John Root** for planning our Fall Tour. It was only forty degrees when we left Davison, our first really cold morning this fall, but the sun was shining as we headed toward Lapeer. The color is not at its peak yet but it was a very pretty drive.

Our first stop was at the Lapeer County Intermediate School District where we were met by David Winstead, CTE Instructor and Luke Childers, Assistant Instructor. They teach the class that received the tools we donated. We were also



greeted by Cheryl Porter, who is the financial officer for Lapeer Schools. She told us that the ISD receives NO money from the State and is totally supported by Lapeer County tax payers. She said that is why our contribution was so important.

David, Luke and Cheryl led a tour of the entire facility which includes several buildings, including a barn where the biggest pig and cow I have ever seen live. Being in an agricultural area, the school has a very active Future Farmers of America club. They also have two green houses where plants and flowers are grown for sale as plants and also made into corsages and arrangements.

We were shown the computer areas, the area that concentrates on heating and cooling (we were told this instructor covets the metal roller), and the medical technology areas. Our guides were familiar with all these departments even though they work in the body shop. All three staff persons were very enthusiastic about the work that is being done at this location and how eight hundred students are being prepared for the future. Luke, the younger body repair instructor, said that he had gone to Mott on Thompson Road and felt that his students learn more at this site than he did at Mott. These students are juniors and seniors in high school.

Our Buicktown Chapter, BCA, logo was very prominently displayed on several walls of the body shop, as well as a plaque on the metal roller. David told us that each incoming student is given a new fender and taught how to paint it at the beginning of the semester to whet their interest. The fender is then dented and the student must use our tools to try to get the fender to look like new. They now have enough equipment so they don't have to wait for a tool to do the assignment.

Leaving the center, we drove through Dryden, Metamora and some even smaller towns. It was a very nice ride to the White Horse Inn where we had lunch. The building was an old hotel built for the railroad in its hay day. It has sloping floors and the upstairs has many small rooms set for tea parties. The food was very good.

Going through Hadley, we approached Porters Orchard, which was packed with weekend cider and doughnut hunters. Leaving there, we were on our own and made it home in time for the Michigan/Purdue kickoff.

It was a perfect trip! Thanks John. You did a good job!

In 2011 the Chapter's newsletter, the Crier, was modified to comply with IRS criteria due to advertising income. Simply stated, the IRS defines advertising income as unrelated to the <u>purpose</u> of the club. Their point being advertising receipts may provide member benefits by decreasing dues or increasing services. If total unrelated business income is in excess of a calculated value, based upon membership income for the fiscal year, then IRS form 990-T shall be filed.

The club's goal should be to publish the club newsletter with the costs being underwritten solely by the membership. However, the IRS does permit limited non-member income in support of club activity, including the newsletter, which is unique to the 501 C 7 classification. The club treasurer must monitor club receipts and advise the board of the situation. If non-member income exceeds limits, the club would lose its exempt status. Non-Member Advertising:

Advertising will be limited to "business card" style graphics.

Advertising charge will be \$ 20 for a 12 month period.

A copy of the newsletter, mailed, is included in the price.

For-Profit businesses shall not receive free advertising.

Non-profit organizations may receive free advertising if space is available.

All advertising must have a purpose that is related to the club's activity.

A club member must sponsor and vouch for each advertiser.
